#### Public Forum

Dist. Cllr James reported, as Cabinet Member, that there was support amongst Cabinet Members, regarding the importance of preserving St Johns Church building. Cllr Penny noted Cllr. James encouraging comments, which would be fed into the St Johns Next Generation Meeting scheduled for later this week.

Dist. Cllr. James also reported the Cabinet's 'plastic free' initiatives were being taken forward by the newly created Plastic Free Working Group. Dist. Cllr. James further added that FoDDC were considering ways that they can immediately move to plastic free activities and initiatives (e.g. how plastic is disposed, non-plastic cup usage, etc.). Cllr. Penny further endorsed the Town Council's support, and reported that the next Working Group meeting was scheduled for 30 January 2019

#### 215. To agree to the budget for 2019 - 2020

Cllr. Thompson led the discussion on the draft budget that had been circulated, following last Full Council meeting, and the Town Clerk further outlined the position. After some clarification it was proposed that the budget, as presented, of £457,600 be agreed.

#### 216. To agree to the precept for 2019

Cllr Thompson led the discussion, and proposed a precept of £395,000

Proposed: Cllr. Thompson Seconded: Cllr. Ball

A counter proposal for a precept of £392,500 was made.

Proposed: Cllr Baird Seconded: Cllr. C Elsmore

On being put to the vote eight were against two in favour & one abstention.

This motion fell.

On being put to the vote eight were in favour with three abstentions.

#### 217. To agree the input to the Forest of Dean youth meeting

Cllr. Penny summarised his 'mapping' exercise, and also Cllrs. Drury and Ball's comments. After further discussion, it was proposed that the Town Council look at a Coleford-focussed solution, building on services already identified, consulting with current users, and more significantly those further afield - currently not engaged, in an attempt to deliver improved services from these discussions.
